ANDRE MODIGLIANI

André Modigliani was born into a Jewish family in Livorno, Italy. In July 1906, he knew from an early age that he wanted to be an artist, though his father was a successful banker and he was enrolled in a school of commerce.

Modigliani worked in stone, often using material from local quarries. His reputation was limited to his planned work as a sculptor of the human figure. His subjects were mostly heads and torsos, and most of the work was done in the studio. He was a prolific carver, and his carvings were often made of stone. He was also a painter, and his paintings were often made of oil on canvas.

Only 25 pieces of Modigliani's stone sculptures survive, but their abstracted and elongated forms provided a template for his later portraits and figure paintings.

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
